

We want to thank all of you who are faithfully participating in the Kroger Neighborhood Reward program. As you know, each time your church Kroger gift cards are reloaded at your nieghborhood Kroger, money is earned for our church projects. When our reloads reach \$5,000 or more, we receive a rebate check from Kroger for 4% of all our associated reloads.

Our current account balance is \$4,201, so we are just \$800 dollars of grocery shopping away from receiving our next rebate check. The card just costs \$5 to start it up, then you can reload it with grocery shopping money amounts of your choosing over and over again.
