Kroger Reward Program earns the church more money.

Thank you for participating in the Kroger Neighborhood Reward Program. As you know, each time your organization's gift cards are reloaded, money is earned for your projects. When your reloads reach \$5,000 or more, your organization receives a rebate check for 4% of all your associated reloads.

For the most recent period of April, 2008 your organizations cards were reloaded for \$1,190. Combined with prior reloads of \$4,201 for a total of \$5,392, you are now eligible to receive the encolsed rebate check for \$215.64
