

Accessibility Plans on Display

The Congregational meeting was opened with sharing plans for completing Accessibility for all levels of our church. The Trustees & Special Task Force have studied many plans or ideas over the past 15 years, and this plan seems to fit our church needs and circumstances the best. This is the plan being presented to the Board first, and if approved, then the Congregation for their review and vote.

Architectural drawings are available for everyone to view and study in the Gathering Place. Please take time to look them over and ask any questions that you might have. The rough cost estimates for this project come to around \$116,000. They include the sanctuary accessibility addition, electrical and plumbing changes needed, exterior emergency ramps and door security changes. (More details and description of the plan will be shared over the coming weeks)

This has been a complex issue to resolve and the Board Thanks the Trustees and Task Force for all their dedication and commitment to finding a solution to our Accessibility needs we began over 18 years ago.

BREADFOR THE WORLD OFFERINGOFLETTERS JUNE 8TH

God is moving in our time to liberate millions of people from poverty and hunger. The world is making progress in the fight to end extreme poverty.

Worldwide, the number of people living on less than \$1 a day is 980 million. This is the first time since 1981 (the year this indicator was first measured) the number of people living in extreme poverty has dropped below 1 billion. Even as the world's population has been increasing, the absolute number of people living in poverty is decreasing. STILL, 854 million people worldwide do not have enough to eat.

In the past two decades, immunization has prevented an estimated 20 million deaths. Mothers who receive at least a primary school education are 50% more likely to immunize their children than mothers with no schooling. STILL, about 1/5 of the world's adult population-771 million adults-do not have basic literacy skills. At least 2/3 of these are women.

The number of children under 5 who die each year has dropped below 10 million for the first time since 1960.

STILL, 28,000 children under 5 die every day from preventable causes, more than half of them hunger-related.

Our world has made progress in fighting poverty. Increase funding by at least 5 billion in poverty-focused development assistance will help people in developing countries the opportunity to work their way out of poverty. The 2008 Offering of Letters will take place June 8th, including letter writing in the Hilty Room immediately following our services. We will be writing letters to our congressmen urging them to increase funding to keep the US commitment to achieve the Millennium Development Goals. Our letters can help change those numbers listed above, and help educate and reduce hunger in developing countries.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Today's world is home to about 6.55 billion people; more than 5 billion of them live in the developing world.
- There is 1 doctor for 350 persons in the United States, while the ratio is 1 to 10,000 in sub-Saharan Africa.
- The average distance girls and women in developing countries walk each day to fetch water is 3.6 miles
