"From the Pastor"

Muse with me in this thought. We are working our way through the book of Genesis during our summer worship services. These last few Sundays we have been reading stories about Abraham. I noticed something interesting. God called Abraham to leave his home in Ur and Haran and reside in Canaan, which will be the land of his descendants. At the age of seventy-five and not having any children, he left for Canaan. After several years in Canaan, Abraham and Sarah still had no children. He began assuming that his servant would receive all his inheritance. But then God told him that it would be through his seed that the promise would be fulfilled. After a few more years and still no children, Sarah urged Abraham to have a child through her slave girl, Hagar. And so he did. What a mess that turned out to be. But later God spoke to Abraham again and told him that Ishmael was not the promised child of the covenant. The covenant promise would go through Sarah.

Did you notice that the fulfillment of the calling and promise was vague at first? It got a little clearer as time went on and more clearly as to how God's promise and calling would be fulfilled. In the mean time Abraham got into many difficult situations and made some bad decisions along the way. But he never gave up the faith that God had called him and that God would somehow provide the way for true fulfillment.

Perhaps this is what our faith journey looks like. We have a vague impression of what God wants us to do. We take some action toward following that vision. But we find ourselves in difficult situations and meet with roadblocks. Doubts arise. Do we quit following our vision? Do we pause and reflect and wait for clearer directions? It seems that these "Abraham stories" can still speak to us. We must always keep our ears and eyes open to the Holy Spirit's guidance. We may make some wrong choices, bad decisions that lead us down dead ends. But it does not mean our vision or God's calling was wrong. It means we need to continue to reflect, pause from our efforts, and be open to the leading of the Holy Spirit in a clearer direction, making different decisions that may bring us closer to the fulfillment of God's promised intentions for us. Perhaps this is what it means to have the faith of Abraham.

Accessibility Plans

The plans for completing Accessibility for all levels of our church is on display in the Gathering Place. The Trustees & Special Task Force have studied many plans or ideas over the past 15 years, and this plan seems to fit our church needs and circumstances the best. This is the plan the Official Board recommends...

Architectural drawings are available for everyone to view and study. Please take time to look them over and ask any questions that you might have. The rough cost estimates for this project come to around \$116,000. They include the sanctuary accessibility addition, electrical and plumbing changes needed, exterior emergency ramps and door security changes.

We have approximately \$39,000 saved for this project, from the former Women's Guild funds, that was designated to be used for this purpose. Also, the Preschool will be funding approximately \$5,000 to go toward the door security changes. These are some rough estimates of funds available now for the project. The Finance Committee is looking into other funding options for us and will report to the Official Board.

"What is an AED?"

An AED is an Automated External Defibrillator. Recently several health emergency situations that occurred at the church caused the Official Board to decided to invest in an AED, to be part of a well-designed emergency response plan. This devise will be available to assist in case of cardiac arrest. This device can be used on anyone-infant, child, adult, male or female. It is designed for simple and reliable operation.

The Official Board will have several Board members go through a training to use the AED along with CPR training. Earlier in the year, the Board designated the Submarine Sandwich sale money to go toward the purchase of this device. Along with money donated by the Preschool we had the total amount needed to make the purchase this past week. Emergency CPR & AED training for members of our Board/church will be happening in the next 3-6 weeks.

The Official Board thought it appropriate to be able to provide assistance to anyone in a life threatening situation quickly and calmly. - Official Board

"Health & Wellness Screenings Offered"
