Congregational Meeting Held

Sunday, Nov. 2, we had 85 people attend the Greenmont-Oak Park Community Church Annual Congregational meeting. Anna Slaidins led the meeting, and Frank Lakins shared financial status information with us.

We are currently, 2008, in a deficit situation with the operating budget, by \$22,193. Frank stressed that we can still make a difference in this situation. He and the Finance Committee challenged us to not let the offering plate pass us by without putting something in it, even if we have met our pledge. They are asking us to go the second mile, if possible.

The Official Board and Finance Committee proposed a new 2009 Ministry Spending plan of \$193,500. This is an increase of a modest 2.65% increase over this years budget. There were decreases made in Mission Outreach and Administrative spending, holding all other program spending the same as this year, and an increase of 3% for staff salaries. The new budget was approved by the congregation.

The 2009 slate of officers was reviewed and approved by the congregation. We still have two open chair positions to fill, the

Finance/Stewardship and Social Committees. Anna asked for nominations from the floor or any guidance for filling these positions. We also have several Vice-Chair positions to fill in preparation for the following year. Please pray and ask God to reveal how you can serve our church and His work through us.

An Endowment report shared that the principle of our funds have remained sound, but there is almost no interest growth, this year. So we will not be able to offer any program grants for the coming year. - Nova Kigar, recording secretary
