### Museum Exhibit, RACE Sharing this information

The exhibit, RACE: Are We So Different?, begins Saturday, Jan. 17 and continues through April 26 at the Cincinnati Museum Center and at other venues throughout the city. A project of the American Anthropological Association funded by various foundations and local community partners, the exhibit will include activities such as community talking circles, essay contests, culture festivals and lectures, as well as a Community Conversation on Race March 10 at the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center. The program explains how human variation differs from race, and when and why the idea of race was invented. The program shows that race is about culture, not biology.

### <u>Top Five Things You can do to</u> <u>Fight, Bias, Bigotry and Racism</u>

We will share this information over the coming two weeks, to learn about steps we can take to fight against bias, bigotry and racism. We have often encountered acts of discrimination, inequality and stereotyping. Sometimes, where we least expect it. Sometimes we are the unwitting victims. And other times, it can even come from ourselves. Learn about these steps of good change: Steps 1 & 2 - this week, Steps 3, 4 & 5 next week. - Social Action

1. Look in the Mirror
It is hard for most of us to acknowledge our own biases. Take the time to stop and evaluate how you interact with others, what words you use, and how you nonverbally interact with those that are different from you.

Education is the key to eliminating the spread of bias, bigotry and racism.
