"Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted, Psalm 25:16.

According to Christian author, Lloyd Ogilvie, loneliness is the anxiety of unrelatedness. It is caused by an inability to establish, develop, and nurture deep, lasting, and satisfying relationships with other people. Most of us do not lack human contact. Our problem is not in the lack of opportunity, but in our deep sense of unrelatedness with those whom we do have contact.

A married man of forty years explained, "We have had a good life together. We have worked hard. Now we are ready and capable for retirement. But we have never really gotten to know each other. I have been occupied all my life in my business. I have not been able to develop any deep relationships with people because my business policy was to always keep my personal life out of my business. My wife has been very busy with the children. We have had the normal kinds of contacts socially. But now, when we have all the time, money, and resources we need, we find that we have very little to talk about. We are just now realizing how lonely we have been all along, although activity and pressures kept us from knowing it." This is loneliness of unrelatedness.

We will always be lonely until we discover a deep relationship with God. St. Augustine prayed, "Lord, you have created us for yourself and made our hearts restless until they rest in you." Our loneliness is rooted in the lack of fellowship with God for which we were created. It is in relationship with God that we learn what it is to be loved and accepted as we are. The season of Lent is the opportunity for us to journey with Christ from our loneliness to a deeper relationship with God. Join us weekly for worship. Fast and pray during these forty days of Lent. "Taste and see that the Lord is good."

We encourage you to join us, even if you have not participated in any WINGS activities... please consider attending this inspiring retreat.


