"From the Pastor"

"And when you pray, you are not to be as the hypocrites, for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on the street corners, in order to be seen by men...and when you are praying, do not use meaningless repetition, as the Gentiles do, for they suppose that they will be heard for their many words.," Matthew 6:5 & 7.

Sometimes I compare my prayers to an addict begging for a fix, who wants to get rid of their pain and misery, but it's not the most helpful or healthy remedy. I remember a time I had terrible stomach flu, doubled up with cramps and I prayed "Take my life now, Lord!" Thankfully, these kinds of prayers are not answered.

Jesus was neither impressed with long, prayers which were prayed to be heard and admired by people, nor with prayers to convince God of something we think we need. Our prayer is a response to God's Spirit at work within us, creating the desire to pray. A multitude of words makes little difference.

Also, most of the time we do not know what we really need, what to really ask. It is probably better to come to God with the simple words, "Lord, have mercy – help me!" Notice the stories of the people who gain Jesus' attention. He is available to the person in need who cry out the brief, but honest prayer, "Jesus, son of David, have mercy on me!" Mark 6:47. It seems that as we pray, Jesus presses us beyond our words and beyond what we think we want to bring us to what is our real condition that needs to be addressed – to where we pray for what really brings more wholeness to our lives. Jesus wants life for us, not a quick fix, not a temporary solution to a deeper problem. Jesus wants us to see what really needs to be changed or addressed to bring abundant life to us. Let us pray at all times, but let our prayers be simple and direct.
