Crop Walk

Thank you to all who supported Church World Service through the CROP Walk on October 10. Walkers were Steve Simmons, Anna Slaidins, Connie and Erik Sink, Lisa and Beth Anne Bleeke, Rev Greg King and Laura, Joe and Robbie Von Holle. While on the walk, we learned some interesting and troubling facts about hunger: In 2006, 53% of the recipients of food from The Foodbank, Dayton and its network of agencies (our pantry is one of them) report having someone in their family who is working; School-aged children in the US who experience severe hunger have higher levels of chronic illness, anxiety and depression and behavior problems; In 2009, 1.02 billion people are undernourished.

We also were invited to continue taking steps to end hunger. One of many ways is to contact our Senators George Voinovich and Sherrod Brown (1-800-826-3688) to urge them to cosponsor Senate Bill 1524. This is the legislation that was the focus of our Bread for the World Offering of Letters last spring. It is a bipartisan bill which lays out several initial and important reforms of the U.S. foreign assistance system. It is important to do this in a timely matter as the bill goes to the Foreign Relations Committee the week of October 19.
