Our Mission Plan for 2010 was mailed to members of our church, describing how our financial contributions will be used (If you did not receive our Mission Plan Book for 2010, please contact the church office, and we will make sure you receive one). Our Stewardship & Finance committee presented pledge cards to those who attended the congregational meeting and will mail the other pledge cards to the rest of the congregation, asking us to prayerfully consider the pledge amount we will contribute to our 2010 mission projects and our various ministries.

This is a good time for me to share with you the meaning of stewardship. We hold as truth that God has given us all we have. The Psalmist declares our faith when he announced, "The earth is the Lord's, and all its fullness, the world and those who dwell therein," Psalm 24:1. God gave you your life, health and property, the earth and the Gospel. Everything we see, we hear, we smell, we taste, we feel, we have is a gift from God. As disciples of Christ we committed ourselves to walking the way of Christ and that means committing "with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our mind and with all our strength" to God. Being a steward is part of discipleship. What does being a steward of God mean? Being a steward of God means being generous with our time, talent, and treasure for the care of God's creation and Christ's church. Because God is loving and lavishly giving and because we are created in the image of God, our stewardship is an expression of love – love toward God and toward God's people and God's creation. Stewardship is part of our vocation. We have been given unique and special gifts for God's special purposes. Using those gifts is a lifelong responsibility. How we use God's gifts and the possessions we have is key to Christian living.

Stewardship means returning the "first portion" of all God has given us. It is a way of thanking God for blessing us. It is a rewarding way of life in which our personal relationship with Christ Jesus is enriched and deepened every day. It is the key to peace by making God's world we live in a better place for everyone.

We are to be content with enough, which means we need to learn to distinguish our needs (enough food, enough clothes, enough shelter, enough money) from our wants. Financial stewardship means giving generously, honestly, and regularly.

Because there is so much of God's work to be done, there is no time to waste. The time spent on each of our activities reflects its importance to us. How are we using our time? God has given us talents. We should not focus on what we can't do, but on what we can and to use them to improve the lives of others. Our relationship with others is a reflection of our relationship with God. Family care should come before work, hobbies and friends. We are members of a very special community – the body of Christ. We are called to care for and serve members of our faith community. And we should treat others as we want to be treated by them. Jesus also commanded us to share our faith and make disciples of others. That means sharing the Good News of God's salvation through Christ. It means be a Christ-like example toward others. It means being active in regular worship and with the services and affairs of our church. It means being conservative in the use of God's earth – its soil, air and water.

Let us remember who we are and to whom we belong. Let us consecrate ourselves to God through Jesus Christ and the stewardship way of life. Our consecration celebration is on Sunday November 22. A Consecration & "Giving Thanks" meal will follow the Morning service. You are invited. You pastor and friend, Greg King
