Т Sometimes I find I am spending longer than fifteen minutes following these "Ten Steps to God." It depends a lot on how long I spend giving Н thanks (I end up thanking God for more than three things as suggested in Ε the guidelines.) or how much I need to ask forgiveness during time of confession.

One of the things I find myself giving thanks to God is for the openings and closings of in life. It is so important to have things either open or closed for the flow life to continue. The opening or closing of each day en-Ρ courages either activity or rest. Just look at the openings and closings of our bodies: the opening and closing of our pupils control the amount of light so A we can see; the opening and closing of our heart valves and our arteries to S maintain blood flow; the opening and closing of our esophagus so we can swallow food or breathe without obstruction; the opening and closing of our Т pores to regulate moisture and heat; and so on. There are the openings and closings of stages of life - each offer its joys and challenges. There are open-0 ing and closings in other parts of nature that are important for life to con-R tinue to flow. For just the simple openings and closings of the things in life, which I take for granted but hold such importance, I am very grateful.

Remember your goal - experiencing a life of a relationship and intimacy with our living and loving God. Keep up with your prayers. Renew your efforts. Join together with your brothers and sisters in praise and worship these next Sunday. Let's witness God transforming our lives.

OFFERING OF LETTERS -MAY 16th

Bread for the Worlds Offering of Letters at our church is approaching!

Bread for the World (BFW) is a collective Christian voice urging our nation's decision makers to end hunger at home and abroad. By changing policies, programs, and conditions that allow hunger and poverty to exist, we provide help and opportunity far beyond the communities where we live.

God's grace in Jesus Christ moves us to help our neighbors, whether they live in the next house, the next state, or the next continent. Food is a basic need, and it is unjust that so many people must go without enough to eat. We can end hunger in our time. Everyone, including our government, must do their part. With the stroke of a pen, policies are made that redirect millions of dollars and affect millions of lives. By making our voices heard in Congress, we make our nation's laws more fair and compassionate to people in need.

Each year BFW invites churches and groups across the country to take up a nationwide Offering of Letters to Congress on an issue that is important to hungry people. Here at our church, we have participated in many Offering of Letters and our letters have made a difference! A few examples of past Offering of Letters' results: strengthening of US nutrition programs; in sub-Saharan Africa projects were successful in improving agriculture, clean water, health and education; establishing the Millennium Challenge Account, a program aimed at reducing poverty and fighting corruption in the world's poorest nations. 6

In 2010, we have many opportunities to change history for hungry people:

President Obama and others have set the goal of ending childhood hunger in the U.S. by 2015. Child nutrition programs will be reauthorized by Congress and Bread is working to increase program access and participation for low-income children. But Food assistance alone will not end childhood hunger. Families need enough financial resources to meet their basic needsincluding food. So this years Offering of Letters will ask Congress to protect and strengthen a few key tax credits that can make a big difference for lowincome people.

Bread continues to be involved in developing the Global Hunger and Food Security Initiative to address world hunger by strengthening agriculture and food security in poor countries. Work continues on the reform of US foreign assistance, the topic of Bread's 2009 Offering of Letters. This Offering will carry over into 2010 as lawmakers continue to wrestle with the reform of US foreign aid. On May 16th our church will be participating in Bread for the World's 2010 Offering of Letters as we will write letters to support the needs of lowincome families. Congress will be debating tax policies and will be deciding which tax credits will be renewed or changed. Tax credits could deliver billions of dollars of assistance to working families struggling to put food on the table. -Connie Sink, Social Action Committee


VBS 2010 Homerun Event!!
