The Social Action committee is pleased to present to the congregation the opportunity to support the CROP WALK on Sunday, October 3. Church World Service is a multi-denominational organization that partners with indigenous organizations to provide long term and emergency support to people around the world. Twenty-five percent of the collections from the Dayton area walk support our local food bank, a supplier to Greenmont's own food pantry. There are 600 walks nation-wide feeding 3,500 food banks.

An exciting CWS project underway internationally is the development and use of bio-sand filters to provide clean and accessible water to villages. A bio-sand filter is like a giant concrete pitcher that filters water through gravel and sand to purify it. A \$20 donation can provide a filter that can serve an entire village. When possible, the materials are locally harvested and workers are indigenous to the village which stimulates the local economy. Once operational, the effective, inexpensive and efficient access to water decreases the incidents of disease, decreases the amount of time spent transporting clean water and subsequently increases the time children can spend in school.

The walk itself is Sunday afternoon starting at Island Metropark and traveling along the bike path. The official turnaround point is at the Siebenthaler Bridge water station, but walkers are invited to walk the distance that is most comfortable. Please consider supporting this effort by either walking, sponsoring a walker and/or praying for all Church World Service projects and service receivers.
