34 Free Church Effectiveness Nuggets Volumes documents that address issues that surfaced by our tabulations from your surveys. The CPT will discuss which of these Nugget volumes may have value for study by the committees & our ministry teams & hand them out to our committees for study.

After studying these volumes, each committee and ministry group will prepare to suggest action-plans for implementing the ideas they feel apply in our congregation. These steps will take a few months to complete. The Congregational Planning Team will participate with the committees and ministry teams of our church to assist and encourage them to follow through on these action-plans, sometimes refining and perfecting these action plans. Our hope is that these efforts will help in creating a stronger future for our church's ministry.

Please keep your leadership, staff, and you pastor in your prayers as we go through this process; and keep the whole congregation in your prayers, asking God how you may serve the Lord through our church's ministries.


