"Anna, Thanks for the Recipe"

Anna provided our lunch at the Official Board retreat in January, and we so enjoyed this delicious soup. So Anna has provided us with the recipe.

<u> Chicken– Tortilla Soup</u>

1 tsp. olive oil 1 cup chopped onion 2 garlic cloves, minced 2 cups shredded cooked chicken breast 1 cup frozen whole-kernel corn 1/4 cup dry white wine 1 TBS. chopped/seeded jalapeno peppers 1 tsp. ground cumin 1 sp. Worchestershire sauce 1/2 tsp. chili powder 31/2 cups fat free chicken broth 1 can diced tomatoes 1 can condensed tomato soup 1/1/4 crushed tortilla chips 1/2 cup fat free sour cream

Heat oil in a large pot over medium high heat. Add onion and garlic; sauté 2 minutes. Stir in chicken and next 9 ingredients (chicken through tomato soup); bring to a boil. Reduce heat, and simmer 1 hour. Ladle soup into bowls; top with tortilla chips and sour cream. Yields 8 servings.

Blankets + Sunday, March 20 We will again be accepting donations for Church World Service's Blankets + Program on Sunday, March 20. Church World Service works with partners to eradicate hunger and poverty and to promote peace and justice around the world. It reaches out to neighbors in need near and far --not with a hand out, but a hand up. Around the world, Church World Service supports sustainable grassroots development, disaster relief, and refugee assistance, and educates and advocates on hunger-related issues. In the U.S., CWS helps communities respond to disasters, resettle refugees, promote fair national and international policies, and provide educational resources. Some of those items are:

CWS is providing services to Brazil following their devastating floods and landslides earlier this year. They are also providing assistance to Indonesia following the recent earthquake and tsunami which claimed more than 500 lives and left more than 11,000 people homeless. On hand currently are food supplies for babies, clean water and sanitation facilities, transitional shelter, clothing, medicines, baby care items, sanitary supplies, blankets, and medical teams. Recovery efforts are scheduled to continue through October of this year.

As voters in Uganda prepare for a contentious general election, CWS has worked extensively to provide community leaders with training in peace building and ways to resolve conflicts without violence. There have been reports of sporadic violence but none in areas where CWS has offered its training.

Ordinary things – things that we often take for granted like blankets, clean water, education, tents, garden tools, seeds and a voice in our future can make a world of difference for people. Be part of this effort to make a difference for people around the world. Social Action


