#### "Jesus said to them, "Loose him and let him go," John 11:44.

We have entered the season of Lent, which bids us to spend more time in daily reflection and contemplation – to think about things – things related to eternal life. We are asked to reflect on the walk of Jesus in comparison to our walk. Jesus kept saying that his walk included embracing death; the disciples rejected such idea and way of life. Jesus' walk included serving and caring for the unimportant (like blessing the children); the disciples wanted to dismiss them. Jesus wanted to loose the burdens which were weighing down people's soul; the disciples were concerned about which one of them were going to be the greatest.

When Jesus was headed toward Jerusalem where he was going to confront the religious leaders and their brand of religion and at the same time confront death, sin and evil, we come across the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. It was, according to John Jesus' greatest physical miracle. It represented a peek to a new age in which he, the resurrected Lord, would do with all his people like you and me. It was not just our physical death that was being addressed it is our spiritual death we may be experiencing now. We are alive, but we are dead to what life can mean to us - to be fully alive. Try this and think about it for a moment: Put your name in the verse, "\_\_\_\_\_, come forth." Have life – be alive abundantly and forever!

There's another part of this miracle story. Jesus commanded the people to unbind Lazarus and let him go. He may be out of the tomb, but he is still bound by grave cloths. We may be out of the tomb through our belief in Christ, but we may not be set free to love. Notice that Jesus did not unbind the grave cloths. He commanded the people to unbind them. Jesus' role during this Lenten season is to help us believe in his power of life. We are the people who are to unbind others from the grave cloths of fear, sick memories, anxious self concern, labels that exclude others from full fellowship. How can we do that? By enabling them by listening and offering a space to let them be themselves and know that they are loved and accepted, neither being judging nor condemning, by praying for them and with them.

This miracle precipitated the anger of the leaders and solidified the plot to do away with Jesus. Yet Jesus did what He had to do out of love for Lazarus and his family. He showed us that the cost of living in this life was never too high for Him. The question for this Lenten season for us is, "What are we reluctant to do for people because of the danger or problems it may cause us? We often choose to be safe, but we smother life from ourselves and live with the burden of guilt and shame or hardness of heart - all of which prevents us from being fully alive now and forever. Let Lent be a time of reflecting on where Jesus is calling us to unbind people in the name of Christ Jesus and then asking for the courage to do it.

#### Living Conditions are Improving

Sunday, March 20 is BLANKETS + SUNDAY at Greenmont-Oak Park Comm. Church. CWS through its Blankets+ program works in partnership with Local communities to identify their needs and access the resources necessary to build the foundation for a more viable future. Activities include emergency supplies in the wake of disasters, tools and seeds for refugees returning home to replant their fields, wells for families in drought-prone areas for drinking water and irrigation of crops and gardens, and Literacy programs and Microcredit for women struggling to realize their potential.

Currently in Nicaragua, 200 families in ten communities are benefitting from water wells to improve their health, irrigate and plant new crops and learn how to raise rabbits for food. In Kenya, new Biogas digesters enable cow manure to be better used as fertilizer and the methane to be used for a clean, sustainable fuel supply so they no longer have to cut down precious trees for firewood. Living conditions are improving and Jobs are being created.

These are just a few examples of how our money and caring promotes God's Kingdom around our world. Join us in this special effort on Sunday, March 20.
