

Nov. 3-5, 2011—Cleveland, OH






Rally Day is Sunday, Sept. 11 Mark Your Calendar Now for this Fall Season Kick-Off Celebration.

At the 9:30 AM Sunday School hour we will have a special program for all ages.


Following the morning worship we will hold a delicious Carry-In Dinner.
