

"...A book of Remembrance was written in His presence concerning those who feared the Lord and honored his name," Malachi 3:16b.

I am so grateful for members of our church who help in a variety of ways in the building of our church, that is, in the building up of one another's faith, in the support and encouragement we offer and receive from one another, and in the care taking of our church premises. How wonderful it is to see us gather for worship, praising God together as one voice and being "The Living Word" of hope, encouragement, and inspiration for one another in our sanctuary.

But we all know that there comes a time in our aging process when our health prevents us from fully participating in the life of our church. There comes a time when our faithful members find themselves permanently home bound or in a nursing facility and can neither participate fully in the work of the church nor come and join us for worship and receive communion along with the rest of us. There comes a feeling of grief at the loss of their connection with the church body. There is a sense of loneliness and sometimes a feeling of worthlessness that pains them.

Our church leaders recognized the importance of making sure that our home-bound saints receive the kind of honor they deserve when they called me to be your minister. One of my important duties was the visitation of our homebound saints- to let them know they are still an important and valuable part of our congregation. I did it with joy and a feeling of appreciation for their lives.

While I was saying my "good-byes" to my home-bound friends, one saintly woman cried out that my departure means no one will remember her. I reassured her that she and others are on a special list, kind of like, "A Book of Remembrance" and she will continue to receive visits from our church. Many of our home-bound members held similar feelings; and each time I gave them reassurance that they will be remembered by our church family and they will continue to receive visits from us.

I have confidence that our church family will make time to visit our home-bound members. I have asked the Membership committee chairperson, Joyce Kelley to help organize teams for the purpose of visiting our home-bound saints. I know that you want to do it, because it is the way to honor them for their service to the church. You can say "Thank you" for their service, and there will be a time that we will be in their situation – cut off from full participation of church life. We would like to be remembered too. As the Apostle Paul said, "What you sow is what you reap." Let us sow the gift of visitation to our members in need, so that, when the time comes we too may receive visits .

During this time of transition, I am asking you to volunteer your service by being a part of a visitation team for our home-bound members. Please contact the church office, or Joyce Kelley, or me. We are having our first meting on Monday evening, September 12 at 7:30. What a wonderful feeling it is to know that you are remembered by those whom you served. -Your friend and Pastor, Pastor Greq
