We're Walking this Sunday -Crop Walk, October 9

Our walk is quickly approaching. The CROP Walk is a community wide event to support Church World Service, an organization that works with partners to eradicate poverty and hunger and promote peace and justice around the world.

CWS continues to support Japan after the March earthquake. They are providing food distribution, pest control & sanitation, mud & debris clearance, psychosocial support and support to women and children. CWS has raised over \$6,900,000 so far to assist those affected by this, the costliest disaster on record.

CWS is also currently providing emergency food and water resources to assist humanitarian aid to drought affected East Africa. It is estimated that 13 million persons are in urgent need of food and water. Our CROP WALK dollars will help these people, and people across our own nation.

25% of our CROP WALK dollars will remain right here in the Dayton area.

Greenmont will participate in the Fairborn Crop Walk on Sunday, October 9. Registration is at 1 p.m. with the walk stepping off at 1:30 from St Luke's United Methodist Church.
