How Christian are we Christians? Are we who call ourselves Christian authentically and consistently Christian, Christian in our conduct and commitment and aspiration?

A few years ago the Canadian scholar, Wilfred Cantwell Smith, wrote a book, *Questions of Religious Truth*, which finishes with a chapter having the title; *Christian Noun or Adjective*. Dr. Smith says that if he asked if he is a Christian he readily answers, Yes. But he continues, if someone asks him if he is Christian, using the adjective, the adjective changes radically. This, he says, I find a searching question, and disquieting; one that undermines my complacency. Indeed, to ponder it is to be set all a-tremble. He sums up: The noun is comforting, the adjective demanding.

If you should ask me if I am a Christian, I will quite, assuredly, tell you that I am. I can claim to be a Christian in terms of background and affiliation and in terms of belief and intellectual commitment. But, I must ask myself, am I Christian, authentically and consistently Christian? The non-adjective distinction makes me very uncomfortable. Harvey Cox, the American theologian, said this: We live in a time of the invalidation of the Christian gospel by Christians themselves. For me that touches a raw nerve.

ambiguity. There is the person who never attends Christian worship services but who will tell you that he or she is just as good a Christian as those stuffy, long-faced people who go to church regularly. Sometimes the adjective is used, in a loose and imprecise way, to designate any act of kindness or compassion, the kind of act that is expected of Christians who take their religion seriously. Such usage is I suppose, quite proper

but I wonder if it is fair to the compassionate Jew or Muslin, the kindly Buddhist or Hindu, the morally sensitive agnostic or atheist.
 Another perspective on this is shown in the story of Philippe Vermeir, a

French pacifist who was imprisoned for refusing to bear arms for his country. His courtesy and kindliness and simple forbearance proved a trial to his hard-bitten jailers, and when he was released his record was given this ironical endorsement: *incorrigibly Christian*.

We are misled when we think of being a Christian and being Christian as matters of achievement. St. Augustine of Hippo, one of the most influential thinkers in Christian history, said that *God deals with us, not as we are, but as we are becoming.* Martin Luther reflected this insight when many years later he wrote, *The Christian is not in a state of being but in one becoming.* Christianness, the, is not a condition but a process.

In the Christian scheme of things we are to be judged not by our achievements but by the honesty and integrity and courageousness of our efforts to manifest the Spirit of Jesus Christ in our lives. Another of Luther's sayings gives us some assurance, and some comfort, to those who struggle in their faith: *God, he says, rides the lame horse.*2 - Peace, Dr. B.
