CHRISTMAS MEMORIES

As I visit the shut-ins and deliver the gifts and cards, we talk about Christmases past and how the family used to gather to celebrate that awesome time of Christmas. For some the families have dwindled down to a "precious few" being left. I can remember when I was a little younger than I am now-probably 6 or 7 – getting up almost in the middle of the night with my brother and sister and seeing all the toys under the lighted Christmas tree. My older sister and younger brother and I would listen real close to make sure our parents were really sleeping and slip out to the living room. The toys were all mixed under the tree and we had to look real close to see who got what. It wasn't long till we each had all our gifts altogether in one area under the tree. We would play as quietly as possible with our toys and at the first sound of mom or dad possibly waking up we would hi-tail-it back to bed and act like we were still sound asleep. When they would come in and tell us to get up we always acted soooo surprised to see all the toys each of us got. We thought they didn't know anything about us being up in the middle of the night playing. What the three of us did not know was that they knew we were up and what we thought were sounds of them waking up was their way of telling us to go back to bed for a while so they could get some sleep. I even remember the year I came down with the mumps on Christmas Eve, what a bummer that was – I hurt so bad and I couldn't even play with my toys.

As I think about some of my past Christmases and those with the family I thought I would share and article I read by Rev. William M Everhart.

Christmas surely evokes memories as no other time or season. We, young and old alike, look to the past at Christmas. At the earliest of ages the child recalls "last Christmas" and remembers. The young married couple recalls what Christmas was when they were children. The parents and grandparents are overwhelmed in remembrances of years and times past.

Christmas memories conjure visions of the Child, the mother and the father, of crowded inns and brusk census takers and expectant shepherds and venturesome wise men. There are moments of reliving celebrations and cantatas, of recalling surprises and feeling again pangs of disappointments when the hopes of Christmas simply did not materialize. The trees and tinsel of yesterday linger and bless.

Christmas opens our minds and our hearts and stirs our beings to face, see and confront the present. The scar tissue from unfulfilled Christmases yields to present urgencies and immediate needs. The train you did not receive in 1935 gives way to the reality of a world poises on the brink World War in the Middle East ... and the birth cries of the Prince of Peace sobers you to the task at hand.

Christmas is now, today, but I cannot linger and you cannot linger to build a tabernacle to encapsulate and enshrine and perpetuate this holy moment.

Christmas, if it be real to us, invites us to take down the lights, throw out the tree (or put it carefully marked into the attic until ...), place the cards of special not away, and venture forth to so the work of the Child.
