FIVE MINUTES WITH GOD

There's a legend – if there isn't, I'll start one – that every newcomer to heaven gets a five-minute audience with the Lord as a gesture of welcome. If you think you're going to make it to heaven, I suggest you sit down now and decide what you're going to talk about, because time flies and once it's gone, it's gone. You don't want to have wasted it on, "Hello, how are you doin'? What do you think of this weather we've been having lately?"

I plan to use my time to find out some things I've always wanted to know but didn't know whom to ask. Like, how come whenever you get jelly in a restaurant it's always grape? I mean, that's a serious matter. Did someone make grape our national fruit? Where is the law that you shouldn't put a little strawberry in there sometimes? Or maybe – maybe even a little orange marmalade? Lord knows, I hope.

And how come when you order coffee they bring you nicely brewed coffee in a steaming glass pot, but when you ask for decaffeinated you get a cup of warm water and a little envelope with some powder that when you dump it into the water looks like something you'd dye an Easter Egg in? And if you want a second cup it's another forty cents. Where did it say on the tablets Moses brought down from the mountain that you shouldn't make decaf in a pot?

And where is it carved in stone that every electrical outlet in the house has to be behind something? And that T-shirts always have to shrink: and zippers only jam when you're in a hurry?

These are important questions in man's search for eternal meaning, and I plan to ask them. 


