#### Search Committee interview questions

In our continuing effort to communicate with the congregation about the ongoing pastoral search effort, the search committee would like to share with you some information about the interview process. With candidates that have warranted that level of mutual interest, we have done two separate interviews. We enter the interview with a specific script of questions we ask each candidate, but may add, delete or modify some questions if the information is included in the written profile we receive from the candidate. The questions range in topical areas to include worship styles, pastoral ministry practices, Christian education, administrative style and church growth, both financial and membership.

Here is a small sample of the questions posed:

\*We draw attention to our new constitution and ask him/her to describe the ideal pastor/laity relationship.

\*"How would you describe your management style?"

\*"We are challenged to attract young people and young families. What has been your experience/ideas on addressing these issues?"

\*"Please tell us how you are/were involved in the Christian education at your present/prior churches".

\*Please describe for the committee what experiences you have had with other churches where you helped them to maintain focus on their long term goals.

\*Have you ever used technology in your worship services and if so, do you foresee using it in the future?

\*Describe strategies you've used in the past to increase church membership. How successful were they?

Some congregational members have asked if items unique to our congregation are discussed with candidates. By sharing some of these questions we hope to reassure you that the candidates and our congregation are entering the discernment process with openness and candor. Concerns brought up at the recent congregational meeting have also been incorporated into our interview process as we move forward.

The search committee would like to be as open as possible during this process, while maintaining the confidentiality of our candidates. Coming forward, we will present to you some of the more potent questions we receive from the candidates as they make their decisions as well.

Please feel free to bring concerns to any committee member. There is a list of names on the bulletin board by the pastor's office door. You can also write them on Sunday's bulletin insert and put it in the offering plate.
