### Whose Calvary?

Now they call that lovely place in Jerusalem the Garden Tomb. It is much like the tomb of Jesus must have been. And in the same place, that rock face with indentations that look so much like the eye sockets of a skull fits in with our feelings about Golgotha. It was General Charles Gordon, the British General, who first noticed how much the side of this old guarry looked like a skull. It was he who first suggested that it indeed might be the place of the Crucifixion of Jesus. When a tomb was found nearby, Gordon was convinced. For years they called it "Gordon's Calvary" because he was the man who discovered it. There is a sense in which Calvary must always be "Every person's Calvary," and there is a sense in which Calvary is my personal Calvary. We often speak of Jesus as "your personal savior, and yet we know that he is also the Universal Savior of all who wish to be saved. There is a sense in which Calvary must always be Universal and can never be Gordon's Calvary, or my Calvary, or your Calvary. Jesus is the Savior of all who will be saved. But there is another side to the matter. The Grace of God in Christ must be experienced personally and individually. That is why we call this Universal Christ a personal Savior. And in that sense, Calvary becomes Gordon's Calvary, or my Calvary, or your Calvary.

As we move into this Lenten Season of Calvary in 2014, we invite you to join us in worship on Sunday mornings and for our mid-week services each Wednesday in Lent at 7:00PM. The Ash Wednesday Service will be held on March 5<sup>th</sup> at 7:00PM with the Imposition of Ashes and Celebration of the Sacrament of Holy Communion. The service is entitled "Remember!" and centered around readings from Scripture. The theme of remembering is taken from the paired "salvation history" Psalms 105 and 106, which contrast the faithfulness of God with the forgetfulness of His **people.** Yet, the Psalms lead into a renewed hope and prayer that God will again *Remember*, and call His people to remember God's remembering!

Our Mid-week service and Sunday services will lead us to the Cross of Christ for our Maundy Thursday at 7:00PM when again we will celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion as we recall Christ's betrayal, trial, and death of the Cross. The choir will bring a Lenten anthem at the Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday services.

On Easter Morning will hold our Early Sunrise Service in front of the bell tower again followed by a breakfast before the 8:45AM service. The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated at both the 8:45 and 10:45 services Easter Sunday. We also invite you to bring those beautiful

### A Report from the Chairperson

A strategic plan really has one goal, to help an organization do a better job. It can help a group focus their resources, time, and energy on the same goals and make sure that the organization's direction is being adjusted due to a changing environment. (Adapted from John M. Bryson, Strategic Planning in Public and *Nonprofit organizations*) Our church has not gone through the strategic planning process since approximately 2006. Having and utilizing a strategic plan is a good operating practice and also a requirement spelled out in our constitution.

On Saturday, January 18<sup>th</sup>, a group of 24 people from our congregation met with Jim Oates from SONKA to start the Strategic Planning Process for our Church. This was just the first step in what will be a multi-step process.

We spent an interactive morning reviewing our Church's history: how our church came to be through the efforts of two neighborhoods,
Greenmont Village and Oak Park, to help address the spiritual and service needs they saw in their community.
During our almost 60 year history, we've only had 4 seated Pastors which is rather unusual.

We also familiarized ourselves with the "Lifecycle of a Church". In this model, the Church's life mirrors the human life: birth, infancy, adolescence, empty nest, etc. Each stage of the lifecycle has varying degrees of four components: Vision (Where should we go?), Relationship (Whom should we bring?), Program (How will we get there?), and Management (What should we avoid?). By analyzing where we are in the lifecycle, we can begin to determine our plan and goals.

The first homework we have is to make a list of things that "you" do in the life of the church? How do you feel about it? Everyone has been asked to think about this for themselves and start to dialogue about it. We'll facilitate these discussions in some Sunday School classes and at some of our Committee and Board meetings. After we have had an opportunity to dialogue around this question, we'll be setting up another meeting to continue our process.

We look forward to your input as we engage in this process over the coming months. We are very excited about the possibilities and are very grateful to have the expertise of Jim Oates. He has brought many churches out of "old age and retirement" back into "adolescence" –youthful exuberance.
