Author Philip Yancey describes two kinds of faith in an article entitled, "When God Seems Silent." Yancey talks about the seeds of faith. There is the David-meeting Goliath kind of faith, - with God all things are possible. Then there is a second kind of faith—the "hang on with all our might" faith like that of Job.

Here are a few promises of God to help you in your daily faith journeys:


- \* God promises to hear my prayers. "Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear" (Isaiah 65:24)

- God promises to put an end to sin and death. "He will wipe every tear from \* their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away" (Revelation 21:4)

Accept and feel confident in these promises and live in faith as you journey through this Lenten season. There are more promises for us, take the time to read them yourself in God's Holy Word. These are God's words for us, to us. Let us turn toward the greatest love we will ever know from our Father and His only Son, Jesus Christ our Savior.



The more households we have participate the more the church will earn. We again thank all those who do earn rewards for our church.


