



Summer Christian Education Focus on Missions

Join us in the Donut room at 9:30 AM. Come and learn about what they do. We will continue with sharing about several missions throughout July.

July 12 Kettering Backpack program This local program is fighting hunger one student at a time. 42% of school age children in Kettering are on free or reduced lunch programs. Over 520 students are being served by the Kettering Backpack program by providing food for the children over the weekend days, so they won't start their next week of learning on an empty stomach. This really impacts the students learning ability.

July 19—Gospel Mission - a local mission service group that is pointing everyone they meet to Christ. They have been serving the community for 103 years. They provide Bible study and computer technology skills training. They serve others through pantry and meal programs, providing other physical needs and they offer Camp Jabez for summer youth enrichment. They work to reach the inner city people. They work to help people find their way through the power of the Gospel of Christ to make transforming changes in their lives.

God's Great Works Revealed again at VBS

June 22 to 26th we had a wonderful VBS experience with 58 students enrolled, most were families from the community and over40 volunteers working at VBS.

We averaged 54 students each day, and two weeks before we only had 12 enrolled. Our God works in mysterious and wonderful ways. We had our misstrust issues, but continued to encourage each other in prayer together for the Lord to send us 42 children. God had bigger plans, and we grew in our trust to follow where we were being led.

Our teen age youth volunteers really stepped up this year. They held the Clue game and silent auction to raise funds, \$620 total, to help cover VBS costs and they volunteered to be crew leaders with the children. We had 19 youth help out, and they managed great responsibility and demonstrated commitment all the way through the week. **FANTASTIC YOUTH**

Along with the youth we had 21 adult volunteers. Several adults were new to the VBS experience, they stepped out of their comfort zone, and they were also great examples of servants of Christ. Those of us who would describe ourselves as veteran VBS volunteers felt a great teamwork and supportive and Spiritually positive atmosphere.

The children attending were also a key component of this year's VBS. They really seemed to connect to the songs and God sightings, and stories of God and Jesus that were shared throughout the week. Their energy and joy for the Lord is a good way to renew ourselves as adults in our faith walk. Our Sunday, June 28th, closing program at worship continued in the same vain as the entire week of VBS. We had several families and children (18) attend worship with us, they enthusiastically shared a couple songs, a prayer, and a bible verse with us. During the week they collected for two Mission projects: Earthquake relief in Nepal (\$126)and food items for our Pantry.



Let us continue to lift prayers for these families and their children, that they may continue on their faith journey and building their relationship with God and Jesus.

Dear Greenmont-Oak Park Church,

The homeless are coming to us in record numbers. For the first quarter of 2015, the number of shelter nights we have provided has increased 31% compared to the same period in 2014. Our food pantries are likewise serving record numbers of families. Many of the conferences will exhaust their resources well before year-end.
