We recently received a letter from Harry Descheene, the Human Resource Director for Pumpkin Patch Fundraisers. He shared some testimonies of the great value of this organization to the Native Americans and their area economy and quality of life. Here are a few:

I am a Navajo, living on the reservation all of my life. Pumpkin Patch has been employing Native Americans for over 20 years. Not only Navajo, but during harvest we also hire Pueblo, both Zuni & Hopi tribes.

My experience as an employee is that Pumpkin Patch goes above and beyond what any organizations of the Reservation do to take Care of their employees.

For many of our workers, this opportunity provides a significant difference in the quality of their lives. Transportation is provided, residential facilities (dorms), laundry facilities, recreational facilities, an upscale kitchen and staff, huge dining hall, and safety orientation before workers actually begin field work. Pumpkin Patch owners are extremely concerned with the welfare of all of their employees both full and part time.

Pumpkin Patch is also grateful for the partnerships to fundraise for your local organizations. Thousands of school children, senior citizen centers, special education facilities, health facilities, church organizations and correctional youth services and civic groups receive free pumpkins for their causes.
