

Unfortunately, the awning selected based on the pantry's needs is rather expensive, so I have been raising funds to purchase it. Reflections on Gun Violence

The Adult Contemporary Sunday School class has finished our study series on gun violence. We discovered that all the states surrounding Ohio have some sort of background check laws and that states that enforce these laws have almost 50% fewer police shootings, suicides using guns, domestic partner shootings and gun trafficking.

After discussing global and domestic implications of gun ownership, we concluded that we would like to see laws addressing background checks, licensing and education about guns. One way to try and get legislation passed is to write to State and Federal representatives and senators. We have drafted a sample letter below if you, too feel the need for a reigning in of guns in attempt to reduce gun violence, accidental shootings, suicides using guns, mass shootings, etc. You can use this link to find the contact info for the representatives you can write to. <u>https://www.google.com/?gws_rd=ssl#q=ohio+representatives</u>. Please consider your stand on guns and how we can make our own backyards safer. Thanks for taking time to read this.

Dear State Rep/Senator:

I am concerned, saddened and angered by the gun violence and deaths caused by shooting here in Ohio and the United States. I feel that stricter laws should be passed especially here in Ohio. It has been proven that laws in other states requiring background checks can reduce the number of shooting deaths of police, suicides using guns, domestic shootings and gun trafficking by nearly 50%.

I would like to see State legislation that calls for

Background checks for anyone purchasing a gun in Ohio Licensing of all guns

Education in elementary & secondary schools that teaches the dangers of guns, etc

Education of gun owners about safe keeping of weapons and the conse-

quences of kids and others who can get a hold of the guns they own Banning Gun and Knife shows if they cannot be compliant with the laws

I believe that although legislation will not eliminate violence, it is the first step in reducing mass shootings, accidental deaths, domestic partners killings and suicides. It is too easy to buy a gun in Ohio. All of our neighboring states have background check legislation. It is time for us to recognize the part we are playing in gun violence. It is time for the shooting to stop.

Thank you very much for taking the time to read this letter and consider what your constituents have to say on this matter. Human life if too valuable to just vanish with the pulling of a trigger. We need your help to keep our families safe.
