



Dear GOPC(UCC) Family and Friends,

On January 20th the 45th President of the USA will be inaugurated. Some will cheer and some will protest. Some will like the new President; others will not. My question is:

Should we pray for the President? I shortened a statement by The Most Rev. Michael B. Curry, Presiding Bishop and Primate of The Episcopal Church. He says:

"According to the Bible we must pray for all who lead in our civic order, nationally and internationally. 1 Timothy 2:1-2 encourages followers of Jesus to pray earnestly for those in leadership, that they may lead in ways that serve the common good. Even in the most extreme case, Jesus himself said, while dying on the cross, "Father forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing," was praying for Pontius Pilate, the Governor of Rome who ordered his execution, and for all who were complicit in it.

When we pray for leaders, we pray for their well-being, for they too are children of God, but we also pray for their leadership in our society and world. We pray that they will lead in the ways of justice and truth. We pray that their leadership will truly serve not partisan interest but the common good. When we pray for them, we are actually praying for our nation, for our world, indeed we are praying for ourselves.

Prayer is not a cheer or declaration of support. Prayers of lament cry out in pain and cry for justice. Prayer can celebrate. Prayer can also ask God to intervene and change the course of history, to change someone's mind, or his or her heart. When we pray for our enemies, we may find that we are simultaneously emboldened to stand for justice while we are also less able to demonize another human being.

Real prayer is both contemplative and active. It involves a contemplative conversation with and listening to God,

As we celebrate the birth of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., we may find guidance in his words, spoken during one of the most painful and difficult struggles in the Civil Rights Movement. He asked that all participants live by a set of principles. The first principle read: "As you prepare to march, meditate on the life and teachings of Jesus."

Should we pray for the President?

Yes!"




If you would like to be a greeter for just a Sunday or an entire month, please sign up on the sheet posted across from the church office.

At this time every year we have a submarine sandwich sale in order to provide a few extras for the Preschool. The church is going to work with us on the sale. This year the profits from sandwiches sold by Preschool parents will go for many of our special programs. These include Breakfast/ Lunch with Santa, filed trips, the Philharmonic String Quartet and picnics in the park. The profits from sandwiches sold by church members will go to their special projects. The prof-

its from sandwiches sold by church members who are also Preschool parents will be equally divided between the church and preschool. Last year we sold 2400 sandwiches.

The sandwiches are really delicious! This year we are offering a sandwich consisting of ham, salami and pepperoni with pizza sauce, cheese and mild peppers. You may order them with or without the peppers on a Pepperidge Farm bun. They are wrapped individually in plastic bags. They cost \$4.00 each.

All orders must be turned in by Sunday, Jan. 22. You may put orders in the offering plate, the Church office or preschool office. You may call in or email your order to the church office.

Then on Friday, Feb. 3 at 3 PM all the fun begins! From 3 to 5 PM we need a few people to make sandwiches for special orders. Then from 5 to 7 we need as many helpers as can come to continue to make sandwiches. We also need a few people to help with baby-sitting from 5 to 7 PM. There is a sign-up sheet on the Church bulletin board.

You need to pick up your orders on Friday night, Feb. 3 between 7 and 8 PM, in the Dount Room. We also require that you pay for your order at the time of pickup. If you cannot pick up your orders on Friday, please notify Valerie Baker by Friday, Jan. 27.

Automatic Tithing
