



Dear GOPC-Family and Friends,

On Thursday, April 13th, we will celebrate Maundy Thursday. **Maundy Thursday** (also known as **Holy Thursday**, **Covenant Thursday**, **Great and Holy Thursday**, **Sheer Thursday**, and **Thursday of Mysteries**) is the Christian holy day falling on the Thursday before Easter.

Most scholars agree that the English word *Maundy* in that name for the day is derived from the *mandatum* (also the origin of the English word "mandate"), the first Latin word of the phrase that means "I give you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, so you also must love each other. This is how everyone will know that you are my disciples, when you love each other." (John 13: 34-5)

One of the ways we can share our love for one another is by sharing a meal. I think it will be appropriate to call this meal a "love Meal." And then we spruce the name up by calling it by the Greek word for love - Agape. And, of course, the USA being the melting pot of cultures, we add the word "International" to the mix - and we have the International Agape Meal! Like Jesus and his disciples, we celebrate the Last Supper by sharing a meal.

You and your loved ones are invited to join in the third annual International Agape Meal on April 13th at 6pm. Like the previous two years, please bring a traditional dish from your country where your ancestors came from. After the meal, we will gather in the sanctuary for a service of diminishing lights. The festive tone of the meal changes into somber and darkness as Jesus enters into the day when he was crucified.

Okay - hmmm...- what shall I bring to share with you? And what will the Irish bring? What will the Lithuanians bring? What are you going to bring to the table? Yummm!

Egg-stra facts

- * Although Easter eggs were once part of pagan spring festivals, they've become Christian symbols of new life. A cracked-open shell also represents Jesus' empty tomb on Easter morning.
- * The early Christians of Mesopotamia began staining eggs red in honor of Jesus' blood shed on the cross. Red eggs remain part of Greek Orthodox celebrations today.
- In some European countries, children go from house to house to collect Easter eggs.
- Each year, the PAAS Dye Co. sells more that 10 million egg-coloring kits, which consumers use to decorate 180 million eggs.
