

Stop, look and listen

Lent, the season of the church year that's associated with repentance, begins on Ash Wednesday. While some people deny themselves by giving up something for Lent, others prepare for Easter through special Bible studies or devotions.

Christians observe Lent for these reasons:

- * It causes us to STOP. Lent says, "Stop and rest awhile," as well as "Stop doing wrong."
- * It tells us to LOOK. Look inward for an honest selfexamination. Look upward to see the cross of Christ offering healing and love. Look forward to the hope of the Ressurection.
- * It tells us to LISTEN. Listen to the words of Christ. Listen to the voice of God. Listen to the winds of the Spirit of God.

Stop look and listen. These three words aren't only important for our safety in travel. They're also helpful for our journey through the 40 days of Lent.

Are you aware over 600 children in Kettering receive food each Friday night to ensure they are feed to start learning Monday morning? It costs \$4 a week (\$132 a year) to ensure nutrition happens over the weekend between free/reduced lunches. Our church does a wonderful job supporting this program as a local mission. Why Evil Exists

The Contemporary Sunday school is beginning a new video series entitled Why evil exists. The course examines the history of cultural definitions of the problem of evil and explores a wide range of proposals that have been devised for living in its shadow. Ancient tests, historical Hebrew and Christian thinkers, as well as secular philosophers will be reviewed in the lecture series. We will approach the subject of evil through numerous lenses to refine the view of this central question of human life, giving a broad and deep resource for individual thought and action.

The video lectures are presented by Professor Charles Mathews, Assoc. Professor of Religious studies at University of Virginia. He teaches religious ethics, theology and philosophy of religion. He received his B. A. in Theology from Georgetown University and his M. A. and Ph. D. in religion from the University of Chicago. The class meets during the Sunday School hour (9:30—10:30 am) in the library. All are welcome to join us in this thoughtful and stimulating series.

Adult Bible Sunday School

Join the 9:30 Sunday morning class as they learn more about Paul's travels to Corinth as they study the book of I Corinthians. They just finished the book of Romans. They found that Paul was a prolific writer who would write to anyone who would believe in God. The fact that he was at one time always looking for people who did not believe in God was then his only way of thinking. Then he felt the wrath of God and through a miracle of God, his whole life turned around. Paul would write to various countries and people telling them how to live and believe like Jesus.
