

Also, please bring a favorite mother's fond item you cherish, that was given to you by your child or children. We will share these special items at our lunch.


Tickets will be \$10 for adults and \$5 for children under age 12.

Jesus Christ...


"Where He Leads me, I will follow; What He wants me to do, I will do."
